## Popcorn Sales are Popping

The annual popcorn sale was kicked off with a pizza party on Tuesday Sept 29 at Forest Hill Church. The sale officially began Saturday Oct 3 and will run for approximately 1 month. Our first weekend out, scouts sold out of caramel corn at Zagara's Marketplace on Lee Road. Our second weekend, we again sold at Zagara's Marketplace as well as Forest Hill Church.

Sales were good, and we are well on our way of reaching our goal of selling \$4500 in popcorn. As of Oct 11, we have sold \$1200 in popcorn and received \$350 in donations. Of the \$1200 in sales, Pack 36 earned a commission of \$408 (34% of the gross sales).

## COMMITTEE DESCRIPTIONS

The Committee Chair has overall charge of the unit committee, which is made of parents of scouts from the pack.

The Recording Secretary handles correspondences to and from the pack, as well as keeps meeting minutes, property inventory, and assists with the annual unit re-charter process.

The Treasurer and Finance Committee have control of the pack finances. They maintain the bank account and check disbursements. It is necessary to have several members on this committee, as we require 2 people to review all bills and sign all checks.

The Membership Committee assists with new member registration, recruiting drives, and keeping scout records up to date, including health forms.

The Advancement Committee provides guidance to uniformed leaders on rank or badge requirements, as well as acquires all advancement badges. This Committee will also help plan advancement ceremonies.

The Activities & Outings Committee plans the various activities for our pack. This would include camping, fishing, hiking, banquets, community service projects, and any special portion of pack meetings.

Public Relations and Communications Committee publishes our newsletter, keeps the web site up-to-date, and keeps everyone informed about Pack 36.

The Training Committee keeps our uniformed leaders training up-to-date. They do not need to conduct the training, as this function is handled by the district training staff.

The Scout Parent Coordinator is a source of information for new scout parents. They help to explain the way parents keep the pack growing.

Special or Ad Hock Committees are created at the discretion of the Committee Chair for special needs or events that happen only once a year, such as popcorn sales, the Blue and Gold Banquet, or the Pinewood Derby.
